SILENT RUNNING JULY LOST BOATS

"I can assure you that they went down fighting and that their brothers who survived them took a grim toll of our savage enemy to avenge their deaths." Vice Admiral Charles A. Lockwood, USN









USS S-28 (SS 133)

Lost on July 4, 1944 with the loss of 49 crew members. She was conducting training exercises off Hawaii with the US Coast Guard Cutter Reliance. After S-28 dove for a practice torpedo approach, Reliance lost contact. No distress signal or explosion was heard. Two days later, an oil slick was found near where S-28 where she had been operating, but the extreme depth of the waters there exceeded the range of available rescue and salvage equipment. The exact cause of her loss remains a mystery.

USS Robalo (SS 273)


Lost on July 26, 1944 with the loss of 81 crew members while on her 3rd war patrol. She struck a mine about 2 miles off the coast of Palawan. Four men survived and swam ashore, then were imprisoned by the Japanese. Unfortunately, they were put on a Japanese destroyer and lost when that destroyer was sunk.


USS Grunion (SS 216)

Lost on July 30, 1942 with the loss of 70 crew members while on her first war patrol near Kiska Harbor. She radioed that she sank two sub-chasers and damaged a third, but was never heard from again. Her loss remains a mystery.



As a symbol of the ability of Americans to mobilize and transform themselves during the war effort, Rockwell might have chosen a more idealized or classic portrayal, just as he based Rosie the Riveter on a classic Michelangelo painting, but he chose to paint her as a girl-next-door, accentuating her authenticity.

The USS Wahoo: A WWII Submarine Legend

The USS Wahoo (SS-238) is one of the most celebrated American submarines of World War II, renowned for its daring missions and remarkable success in the Pacific Theater. Commissioned on May 15, 1942, Wahoo was a Gatoclass submarine named after a swift and powerful fish. Commanded by Lieutenant Commander Dudley W. "Mush" Morton, Wahoo became legendary for its aggressive tactics and significant contributions to the war effort, embodying the relentless spirit of the U.S. Navy's submarine force.

Wahoo's early patrols in the war were marked by challenges and learning experiences. Her first patrols in the Pacific, under the initial command of Lieutenant Commander Marvin G. Kennedy, yielded limited success. However, it was not until Morton took command in December 1942 that Wahoo began to demonstrate its full potential. Morton's aggressive approach and innovative tactics transformed Wahoo into one of the most feared submarines by the Japanese Navy.

Under Morton's command, Wahoo embarked on a series of patrols that showcased her deadly efficiency. On her third war patrol, Wahoo achieved remarkable success, sinking eight Japanese ships, including the 11,600-ton transport Buyo Maru. This patrol, conducted in the Yellow Sea, marked Wahoo as one of the top-performing submarines in the U.S. fleet. Morton's bold tactics, such as surfacing in the midst of enemy convoys to launch attacks, set new standards for submarine warfare.

Wahoo's fourth war patrol further solidified her reputation. Operating in the dangerous waters off the coast of Japan, Wahoo sank several enemy vessels, including the transport Nittsu Maru and the freighter Zogen Maru. Morton's willingness to take calculated risks paid off, as Wahoo consistently outmaneuvered Japanese anti-submarine forces. The daring attacks and high success rate earned Wahoo and her crew numerous commendations.

The fifth war patrol was perhaps Wahoo's most famous. In January 1943, Wahoo entered the Sea of Japan, a heavily patrolled and perilous area. Despite the dangers, Wahoo achieved unprecedented success, sinking four enemy ships and damaging others. This patrol included the sinking of the 8,000-ton freighter Kaga Maru and the escort vessel Tatsutake. Morton's fearless leadership and the crew's relentless determination turned Wahoo into a symbol of American naval prowess.

Wahoo's sixth patrol continued her streak of success, but it was also fraught with peril. Operating off the coast of Formosa (now Taiwan), Wahoo sank the tanker Tosei Maru and several other vessels. However, the increasing effectiveness of Japanese anti-submarine tactics posed significant threats. Despite the dangers, Wahoo's crew demonstrated exceptional skill and bravery, continuing to inflict substantial damage on enemy shipping.

Tragically, Wahoo's seventh patrol in October 1943 would be her last. After a series of successful attacks in the La Pérouse Strait, Wahoo was ambushed by Japanese aircraft and surface vessels. Despite her crew's valiant efforts, Wahoo was lost with all hands on October 11, 1943. The exact circumstances of her sinking remained a mystery for decades until her wreck was discovered in the La Pérouse Strait in 2006, providing closure to the families of her brave crew.

The legacy of USS Wahoo endures as a testament to the courage and ingenuity of her crew and the leadership of Commander Morton. Wahoo's aggressive tactics and impressive success record significantly impacted the Pacific war effort, sinking 20 enemy ships totaling over 60,000 tons. Wahoo's exploits inspired future generations of submariners and cemented her place in naval history.

USS Wahoo's story is not just one of warfare but also of innovation and strategic brilliance. Morton's emphasis on aggressive engagement, combined with the crew's unwavering dedication, demonstrated the critical role of submarines in modern naval warfare. A key figure in this legacy was Richard H. "Dick" O'Kane, Wahoo's executive officer (and future Medal of Honor recipient). While serving as the executive officer on the Wahoo, O'Kane played a crucial role in planning and executing the successful attacks. O'Kane's contributions and later achievements as a commanding officer of the USS Tang further highlighted the profound impact of Wahoo's operations on submarine tactics and strategy.

The USS Wahoo remains an iconic symbol of American naval history, embodying the spirit of daring and resilience that defined the submarine force during World War II. Her achievements, sacrifices, and the indomitable spirit of her crew continue to be remembered and honored, ensuring that the legacy of Wahoo lives on in the annals of naval warfare.


The Arrow and the Song

Long, long afterward, in an oak I found the arrow, still unbroke; And the song, from beginning to end, I found again in the heart of a friend.


