JANUARY LOST BOATS

"I can assure you that they went down fighting and that their brothers who survived them took a





USS Scorpion (SS-278)

Lost on Jan 5,1944 with the loss of 77 officers and men in the East China Sea, on her 4th war patrol. It is assumed she was sunk by a mine.





USS Argonaut (SS-166)

Lost on Jan 10, 1943 with the loss of 102 officers and men off Rabaul, on her 3rd war patrol. While attacking a convoy, she torpedoed a Jap destroyer who along with 2 other destroyers depth charged her. As she tried to surface, the destroyers sunk her by gun fire.





USS Swordfish (SS-193)

Lost on Jan 12, 1945 with the loss of 89 officers and men somewhere near Okinawa, on her 13th war patrol. Probably was lost to a mine.





USS S-36 (SS-141)


Lost on Jan 20, 1942 with no loss of life, on her 2nd war patrol. She ran hard aground on a reef and radioed for help. The entire crew was rescued by a Dutch ship after they scuttled her.





USS S-26 (SS-131)

Lost on Jan 24, 1942 with the loss of 46 officers and men in the Gulf of Panama, on her 2nd war patrol. She was rammed by the USS PC-460 and sunk within seconds. The CO, XO and one lookout on the bridge, were the only survivors.

Lieutenant James Earl Carter Jr., USN 39th American President

President James Earl "Jimmy" Carter graduated from the <u>U.S. Naval Academy</u> in 1946 with distinction, after which he was assigned to USS *Wyoming* (E-AG 17) as an ensign. After completing two years of surface ship duty, Carter applied for submarine duty. He served as executive officer, engineering officer, and electronics repair officer on the submarine <u>SSK-1</u>. When <u>Admiral Hyman G. Rickover</u> (then a captain) started <u>his program to create nuclearpowered submarines</u>, Carter wanted to join the program and was interviewed and selected by Rickover. Carter was promoted to lieutenant and from 3 November 1952 to 1 March 1953, he served on temporary duty with the Naval Reactors Branch, U.S. Atomic Energy Commission, Washington, D.C., to assist "in the design and development of nuclear propulsion plants for naval vessels."

From 1 March to 8 October 1953, Carter was preparing to become the engineering officer for <u>USS Seawolf</u> (SSN-575), one of the first submarines to operate on atomic

power. However, when his father died in July 1953, Carter resigned from the Navy and returned to Georgia to manage his family interests. Carter was honorably discharged on 9 October 1953 and transferred to the retired reserve at his request with the rank of lieutenant. The *Seawolf*-class submarine *Jimmy Carter* (SSN-23) is named for the 39th president. Read President Carter's complete biography.





The History of the USS Barb (SS-220)

The USS Barb (SS-220), a Gato-class submarine of the United States Navy, distinguished itself as one of the most decorated submarines of World War II. Constructed by General Dynamics' Electric Boat Division, Barb's keel was laid on June 7, 1941. She was launched on April 2, 1942, and commissioned shortly thereafter on July 8, 1942. Over her service, Barb demonstrated unparalleled adaptability, ingenuity, and bravery across both the Atlantic and Pacific theaters of war.

In her early operations, Barb undertook five war patrols in the Atlantic, primarily focusing on disrupting Axis maritime operations. One of her early notable missions was in support of Operation Torch, the Allied invasion of North Africa in November 1942. Beyond this, she also intercepted Axis blockade runners in European waters, significantly hindering enemy supply chains. By spring 1943, Chief of Naval Operations Admiral Ernest J. King ordered Barb to the Pacific Fleet, where she would achieve her most remarkable successes.

Between March 1944 and August 1945, Barb completed seven war patrols in the Pacific, where she became a nightmare for Japanese shipping. She sank a total of 17 vessels, amounting to 96,628 tons of enemy shipping. Notably, during her sixth war patrol (her first in the Pacific), Barb scored a decisive victory by sinking the freighter Fukusei Maru and collaborating with USS Steelhead to bombard industrial sites in the Philippines, triggering massive explosions.

A key chapter in Barb's Pacific operations began in May 1944 when Commander Eugene B. "Lucky" Fluckey took command. Under his leadership, Barb's seventh war patrol saw the sinking of five ships and two sampans, accumulating over 15,000 tons of enemy shipping. This marked the beginning of Barb's legacy under Fluckey's bold command, which included daring attacks on heavily defended targets.

One of Barb's most legendary exploits occurred during her eleventh war patrol in late 1944 and early 1945. Operating along the east coast of China, Barb entered Namkwan Harbor, a shallow and heavily mined area, where she launched eight torpedoes against a fleet of 30 anchored enemy ships. The audacious attack resulted in eight direct hits, sinking three ships and causing significant damage to oth-

ers. For this mission, Barb earned a Presidential Unit Citation, and Commander Fluckey received the Congressional Medal of Honor.

Barb's innovation extended beyond traditional submarine warfare. On June 22, 1945, she became the first submarine to launch rockets in combat, attacking Japanese shore installations in Shari. Later, on July 19, Fluckey and his crew executed an extraordinary operation that involved a small team going ashore to plant explosives on a Japanese train track. The explosion derailed a train, destroying 15 cars—a rare instance of land-based sabotage conducted by a submarine crew.



By the conclusion of her wartime service, Barb had not only sunk numerous enemy ships but had also demonstrated unprecedented ingenuity and courage. Her final patrol ended on August 2, 1945, at Midway. Over the course of her illustrious career, she not only dealt devastating blows to enemy forces but also rescued 14 Allied prisoners of war, showcasing the humanitarian aspect of her operations.

Following her decommissioning and recommissioning multiple times, the USS Barb was finally decommissioned on December 13, 1954. She was subsequently acquired by Italy, marking the end of her storied service in the U.S. Navy. The legacy of Barb and her crew, however, remains immortalized in naval history, epitomizing innovation, valor, and the relentless pursuit of victory.
