

SILENT RUNNING SEPTEMBER LOST BOATS

"I can assure you that they went down fighting and that their brothers who survived them took a grim toll of our savage enemy to avenge their deaths." Vice Admiral Charles A. Lockwood, USN



USS S-5 (SS-110)

Lost on September 1, 1920 when a practice dive went wrong and she sank bow-first, with her stern showing above the water. In a dramatic adventure, her exhausted crew was rescued during the next few days. Salvage attempts were unsuccessful, S-5 settled to the bottom and was abandoned.





USS Grayling (SS-209)

Lost on Sept 9, 1943 with the loss of 76 men near the Tablas Strait. Grayling was on her 8th war patrol and sank two ships before being lost.





USS Pompano (SS-181)

Pompano was sunk (between Sept 17 and Oct 5) with the loss of 77 men while on her 7th war patrol. Possibly lost on Sept 17, 1943. Japanese records show that a submarine was sunk in her patrol area on 17 September by air & depth charge attack off the Aomori Prefecture near Shiriya Zaki. Before being lost, she sank two enemy cargo ships. The exact cause of her loss remains unknown, but she probably was sunk by the air/sea attack above or fell victim to a mine on or after 9/25/1943. This boat's last recorded ship (Taiko Maru) sunk happened on Sept 25th, so she probably hit a mine on or after that date but before Oct 5th, when she was scheduled back at Midway.



USS S-51 (SS-162)

Lost on Sept 25, 1925 with the loss of 33 men when it was sunk after collision with SS City of Rome off Block Island.






USS Cisco (SS-290)

Lost on Sept 28, 1943 on her first war patrol with the loss of 76 men in the Sulu Sea west of Mindinao.





More than Just Decorations: The USS *Parche* (SSN-683)

If you were to ask an average person to name the most decorated vessel in US Navy history, they would probably guess that it was a ship from World War II. They might assume it was an aircraft carrier, and some may even think it was a WWII submarine. However, in most cases, they would assume it was a vessel that had seen significant combat. Few would guess that the Navy's most decorated vessel never fired a shot in anger. Yet, it was precisely that—a Cold War submarine, the USS *Parche*—that received the honor of being the US Navy's most decorated vessel. This distinction was earned through the *Parche*'s service as a special operations boat, carrying out some of the most daring and risky operations ever performed by a submarine.

Commissioned on August 17, 1974, the USS *Parche* was among the last ten boats of the Sturgeon class, referred to as the "637 stretch" because they were ten feet longer than the standard 637 submarines. The *Parche* was initially intended to serve in standard attack submarine roles within the Navy's fleet. After its first two years as a fleet attack submarine in the Atlantic fleet, the *Parche* was transferred to its new home port in Mare Island, CA.

With the increasing geopolitical tensions of the Cold War between the U.S. and the Soviet Union, the need for intelligence and underwater surveillance capabilities grew, paving the way for the *Parche*'s transformation. Upon its transfer, *Parche* underwent extensive modifications. These modifications included an extension of the hull by another 100 feet to accommodate intelligence-gathering equipment. Such enhancements enabled the *Parche* to perform a wide range of covert tasks beyond those of a conventional attack submarine, making it an ideal underwater platform for intelligence gathering, electronic surveillance, and special operations.

During the Cold War, the USS *Parche* undertook some of the most daring espionage and surveillance missions ever conducted by the US Navy. It was particularly noted for its role in Operation Ivy Bells, a mission that involved tapping undersea communication cables to gather intelligence on Soviet naval activities. These operations were highly classified, shrouded in secrecy for decades, and demonstrated the submarine's exceptional ability to operate undetected in hostile waters. The operations were also wildly successful, allowing the US to eavesdrop on unencrypted communications by the Soviet Military.

In one notable cable-tapping mission, the *Parche* traveled to the Barents Sea from Mare Island by heading south through the Pacific, rounding Cape Horn at the tip of South America, and then traveling north through the Atlantic to the cable location in the Barents. Dubbed "Odyssey '82" by the *Parche*'s crew, the mission covered 15,000 nautical miles each way, entirely underwater. All told, the *Parche* spent 137 days at sea on this particular mission.

Throughout its service, the USS *Parche* achieved numerous accolades, making it the most decorated vessel in US Navy history. These awards included nine Presidential Unit Citations, ten Navy Unit Commendations, fifteen Navy Battle "E" awards, and thirteen Expeditionary Medals—a record that remains unparalleled to this day.

The *Parche*'s renown extended beyond its operational achievements, as the boat became a testing ground for several technological innovations. It was equipped with advanced sonar and electronic warfare systems that allowed it to execute its missions with precision and stealth. The submarine pioneered several techniques in undersea operations, including advanced eavesdropping and reconnaissance methods that set the standard for future special missions submarines. These advancements have had a lasting impact on submarine design and operations for subsequent vessels and classes.

After the Cold War, the *Parche* continued to serve with distinction, adapting to new threats and challenges in the evolving geopolitical landscape. It remained an invaluable asset in gathering intelligence and conducting special operations, contributing to national security even after the fall of the Soviet Union. The submarine carried out several missions in the 1990s and early 2000s, maintaining its relevance in an era marked by shifting strategic priorities. In addition to intelligence-gathering operations, the *Parche* also engaged in mapping and object recovery missions, supported the deployment of Special Forces such as Navy SEALs, and participated in the evaluation and testing of new submarine technologies.

Despite what we know, much of the *Parche*'s service remains shrouded in secrecy. Still, the submarine has been honored in various ways. Its sail is on display at the Naval Undersea Museum in Keyport, Washington, serving as a reminder of the submarine and the men who served aboard her. Recognition of some of the *Parche*'s exploits is chronicled in books such as *Blind Man's Bluff* by Sherry Sontag and Christopher Drew. Although the full extent of the *Parche*'s operations is likely never to be fully disclosed, the submarine's place in naval history is firmly secured.

The history of the USS *Parche* (SSN-683) is a testament to innovation, bravery, and exceptional service. It further proves that such bravery and exceptional service can be demonstrated without engaging in actual combat. The *Parche* remains a symbol of the Navy's ability to adapt and innovate, executing complex and dangerous missions in the most challenging environments. Remembering and honoring the *Parche* and its crew ensures that their extraordinary achievements will not be forgotten.


